

Gala (spring) – This fundraiser (previously known as the “One Heart-at-a-Time Gala) is our schools most profitable. Next year we are switching it up so stay tuned for details to unfold! Regardless of what we do for our major fundraiser next year, it will take many hands to make it successful and planning meetings for the committee begin in the fall. Lots of opportunities to volunteer both prior to the event (like classroom auction items, soliciting and collecting auction items) or even on the day itself with set-up and clean-up.

Jog-A-Thon (fall) - This is the children's favorite fundraiser as they get a hand in raising the funds themselves through sponsorship and jogging! Planning begins early summer and this fun event takes place soon after the new school year begins, during a school day. Lots of areas to volunteer before, after and during the event (e.g. collecting donations for prizes, set-up and clean-up etc).

Super Bowl Party-Crab Feed (January) - This is a fun dinner party fundraiser for adults only, with all you can eat crab! Needless to say its football themed and we encourage you to enter your table in the table decorating competition. Areas for volunteering include set-up, serving and clean-up with some pre-event help needed too.

Breakfast with St. Nick (Sunday December 6) – Although this event raises only a small amount of funds for Family Club, its focus is clearly providing Christmas fun for the whole family. A pancake breakfast is served and there are dozens of tables of crafts and games for the children to be entertained. Planning begins in mid-October with lots of opportunities to volunteer before the event (like designing crafts and games & shopping for food), but also on the day of the event with set-up, running a table and clean-up.

Library / Literary – Throughout the year our library provides many opportunities to get involved. We have 2 Scholastic Books Fairs per year (spring and fall) that require set-up, take-down and cashiering. “Read-Across America” is a week long celebration in March during which we celebrate Dr. Suess’ birthday. There is a “Classics Reading Program” all year long, after which participants are recognized at an end-of-year party. If the Library and all that extends from it interests you, this is the place to sign-up.

Hospitality - Family Club are responsible for supporting many food related event/days throughout the year. Monthly staff luncheons (on half days), post Mass hospitality (twice a year), year end parties (choir and student council etc), Community Open House Day, Teacher Appreciation Week or Back to School Night (just to name a few). Several people are needed to help this committee with either shopping for food, small food contributions, set-up and clean-up. On-going or occasional support welcomed.

Athletics – There are quite a few opportunities to volunteer in this department including coaching positions for basketball and volleyball for several grades (both male and female teams). Track and Field requires coaches and hands on parent assistance for both practices and the actual diocesan-wide Track and Field Day which is held in May. Other areas of opportunities are Presidential Fitness Testing, which is usually held on a morning only towards the end of April and “Field Day”, a fun end of year event.

Valentines Candy Grams (around Feb 14) – This is a small fundraiser where kids (and grown-ups too) get to send Candy Gram’s to each other. Prior to the day, volunteers are needed to shop for candy and make up the goody bags (100’s!). Volunteers are also needed on the day to deliver the Candy Grams to the classrooms and teachers.

Uniform Bank – Volunteers are needed to assist the Chairperson of the Uniform Bank with the collection, sale and management of our used uniforms throughout the school year. We hold two Uniform Sales per school year; one just before school starts at the New Family Social and the other in the spring.

Box Tops for Education – Our school collects Campbell’s labels and “Box Tops for Education” all throughout the school year (and summer too!) and a volunteer is needed to help the coordinators with counting and tracking all the labels and box tops, throughout the year.

Pizza Lunch – One volunteer needed to purchase and maintain serving supplies for Pizza Lunch Friday’s.

St. Joseph’s Table (March 19) - This event commemorates the Feast Day of St. Joseph and starts with a song and worship at the hall in the morning and is later followed by a lunch. Volunteers are needed to set-up, serve lunch and clean-up.
